The casino's operation will create 200 full-time jobs, a majority being union employees with an average annual wage of about \$72,000—not to mention the additional 200 workers involved in the casino's construction. What's more, an estimated \$65 million annually will be given to the New York Lottery Education Fund to bolster public schools. Finally, \$3 million per year will go to the Town of Newburgh, benefiting the Newburgh Public Safety Fund and community projects.

"We are elated at the opportunity to help revitalize the Newburgh Mall, create good-paying union jobs for local residents, and generate significant revenue for New York State's public schools," says Bob DeSalvio, President of Genting Americas East, the company that owns the Resorts World chain. Orange County Executive Steven Neuhaus echoes this sentiment, saying, "It is an investment in jobs, in growth and in the future of Orange County, and it will have an immediate—and positive—impact at a time when we need it the most."
